Rosie also reported on our political button project for the purpose of raising funds for the committee and shared the designs to the Executive Committee members who were present. David Reuther reported on the phone banking and the donation to candidate Washington's try in the 22nd Senate District Special election. Rosie reported on our new internet and phone service for the office from Verizon Wireless.

New business:

Discussion followed on the three seats for the Board of Supervisors, three seats for the School Board, four seats for the Town Council and the position of Mayor. This was followed by the 7th District's seat.

New Business (Continued):

Complete information about Bob Buettgens funeral was presented. (Between 20 and 30 members attended.)

Charles Jameson informed us of the exhibit on display at the Culpeper Library of material about Black History Month and Carver Regional High School.

Introduction of Guest – Eileen Bedell, our candidate for Congress in 2016, arrived at 7:02 PM. She made 15-20 minute presentation about what she felt went right, what went wrong, what she learned, and what she would do different. She answered questions for ten more minutes during which she praised the assistance CCDC gave her throughout her campaign.

New Business (Continued):

A short discussion followed about the Woman's March on Washington and the participation of members and associates of CCDC.

The last item was a request from the Culpeper County Board of Elections to the Chairman for paid precinct workers for the June Primary and November election at each precinct. Seventeen precinct workers have retired and these vacancies need to be filled according to James Clements the Voter Registrar for the County of Culpeper. (Four people stepped forward.)
